Important Tips for Rising Juniors

- 1. Visit the CMS Service Learning Website to see topic ideas and service/learning opportunities. Your topic must lend itself to a service/learning experience.
- 2. Enter 11th grade knowing what issue you'd like to write about, what your position on that issue is, and what you could do for a service/learning opportunity.
- 3. Look at pages 15 and 27 of the graduation project manual to see what the paper requirements are.
- 4. Start gathering articles, books, documentaries on your topic of interest.

Important Tips for Rising Seniors

- 1. Consult page 39 and 40 to see the service/learning experience guidelines.
- 2. Visit the links below to see what service opportunities are already set-up for CMS and Hopewell students.
- 3. Have a resume and a letter to the review board prepared when you enter 12th grade. The letter to the review board guidelines are on page 60 of the Graduation Project manual.
- 4. Create a log and document the time spend on experiences related to your chosen topic. A sample log can be found on page 45 of the graduation project manual.
- 5. Reflect on the service learning experiences you've participated in throughout high school.
